COMMUNICATION WITH PARENTS

We are here to serve the faith formation and development needs of our children, youth and adults. In order for us to achieve that goal, effective communication is necessary.

Important Reminder: It is important that our records be as accurate as possible. Please remember to contact our office if you should change your phone, address or e-mail information.

We protect your privacy by not distributing your contact information to any other organization. If you have an email address that you check regularly, please be sure to provide that to us. Email is used for important reminders and announcements (e.g. parent meeting reminders and last minute class cancellations).

If you have any questions, concerns, comments, or suggestions, please feel free to share them with our office. You may contact us by mail, fax, phone or e-mail as indicated in this handbook. We also encourage you schedule an in-person appointment to discuss any concerns or questions.

We will contact you and send you information using a variety of methods.

- ♣ We may contact you by phone and/or e-mail and/or text messages with IMPORTANT reminders and announcements, including class cancellations.
- ♣ We will often send home notices with your children. **Ask them regularly if they have any information for you.**
- ♣ We have a Faith Formation section in the parish bulletin that is updated weekly. Please take one every week before you leave Mass and refer to it.
- ♣ Our Parish Website is kept up to date with links to all program calendars and important forms.
- ♣ Information may be mailed to your home by first class or bulk mail. Please be sure to read all mail carefully and promptly since material may be time sensitive.

MASS ATTENDANCE

“The definitive aim of catechesis is to put people not only in touch ,but also in communion and intimacy, with Jesus Christ.”

Our curriculum is always presented within the context of the liturgical year. Children and families learn primarily about the faith by worshiping together, fully engaging in the prayer of the Church throughout the year and participating in parish life. Our regular religious education sessions are intended to complement, not substitute for regular Mass attendance.

All families registered in our program are expected to attend Mass regularly. Since it is such an integral part of our program, children may be asked about Mass attendance and the Sunday Scripture readings are often a part of their lesson. Weekly Mass attendance will help your child to participate fully in and class.

PLAN AHEAD: We find that the most effective strategy in successfully getting your family to Mass every week is to plan your weekend schedule ahead of time. Perhaps on Friday evening, as you look at your weekend activities, be sure to set Mass attendance as a priority, review the Mass times at the Church of the Holy Rosary (and neighboring parishes if necessary) then determine together what Mass you will attend.

If you are having difficulty finding time to attend Mass regularly it may be a good time to take a closer look at your family’s activities and to prayerfully discern adjusting that schedule in order to ensure that regular participation at Mass is possible.

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

Our Curriculum is intended to provide children and their families with knowledge of the teachings of our faith based on Scripture and the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Every year children and families will learn about the seven major themes of faith:

- ♣ Revelation – How does God reveal himself to us through Scripture, the Church, and our daily lives?
- ♣ Trinity – How does the mystery of God; Father, Son and Spirit live in us and challenge us to discipleship?
- ♣ Jesus Christ – Who is Jesus, why did He come among us, and how can I develop a relationship with Him?
- ♣ The Church – What is the Body of Christ and how is each person a member of the Body?
- ♣ Morality – What are God’s laws of love and how can we follow them more faithfully?
- ♣ Sacraments – How does the church worship and how does God’s grace fill us in the sacraments?
- ♣ The Kingdom of God – What is the Kingdom of God and how can we work for justice and peace?

These themes are presented every year in a manner that is appropriate to each grade level.

Faith formation is a lifelong process!

ATTENDANCE

The classroom calendar is contained in this handbook. HOWEVER, since class dates may change unexpectedly, parents are requested to rely on the calendar under the “Sacramental Preparation for Children” tab on our website (holyrosaryedgewater.org.)

Attendance will be monitored carefully. Ideally, students should miss classes only for illness or an emergency (not sporting events or similar events).

If a child misses 3 or more classes over the course of one school year, they MAY be deemed unprepared and may be required to repeat the year.

BOOKS

Books are given to children on the first day of classes.

If a student loses a book he/she must purchase one at an additional cost.

Children generally will be taking their books home since they often be assigned homework.

All children are expected to always bring their books to class.

WHAT WE EXPECT FROM STUDENTS

1. Respectfully LISTEN.
2. Participate in all classroom discussions, volunteer to answer questions, and be ready when called upon to participate.
3. Complete all homework assignments (including chapter readings) given by their teachers.
4. Behave in a Christian manner at all times showing respect and being cooperative with adults and other students.
5. Attend classes regularly.
6. Bring all required materials.
7. Dress appropriately and respect their own bodies by dressing modestly.
8. Respect others' property and school property.

Students who fail to participate in a meaningful way, or who do not complete the majority of homework assignments, MAY be deemed unprepared and may be required to repeat the year.

WHAT WE EXPECT FROM PARENTS

1. Be an active part of their children's learning and the primary example of faith and discipleship for their children.
2. To provide for their child's regular participation at weekly Mass.
3. To provide for their child's regular attendance and punctuality for class.
4. To contact the Religious Education office if their child is unable to attend a session.
5. To complete all home assignments with their child.
6. To talk with their child about what he/she learned at sessions and review homework assignments when applicable.
7. Communicate any special needs or circumstances that may affect their child within the classroom.
8. Communicate any concerns, questions, or suggestions.
9. To pray with their child at home.
10. Attend any parent/teacher conferences, sacrament preparation meetings, etc.

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL

We appreciate your cooperation in following these guidelines in order to keep your children safe.

1. Students gather in the Parish Center Chapel (26 Edgewater Place) no later than 9:15am.
2. Classes start promptly at 9:30am.
3. Students will be taken by their catechist, to their classroom, together as a group. **No student is permitted to enter (or remain) in a classroom unless the catechist is present.**
4. The inside door of the Parish Center always remain locked. This is done for the safety of the children in order to prevent strangers from entering the building.
5. Parents and students are required to check-in with Dr. Jeanette Martucci at the reception desk upon entering and leaving the premises.
6. Please be prompt in picking up your children. This demonstrates your consideration of our catechists and support staff.
7. Parents are expected to pick up their children UNLESS the Parish has previously received your written authorization that your child can walk home unattended.
8. Repeated tardiness in picking up a child may result in a parent conference.
9. No student may leave the school building before the regular dismissal time unless excused by Dr. Martucci or the Program Coordinator. This must be accomplished by sending in a note from the parent/guardian stating the reason for the need of an early dismissal.

HEALTH CONCERNS AND MEDICATIONS

1. If your child has health issues or special needs, it is important that you accurately listed same on your child's registration form.
2. Please remember to keep the office informed of any changes to your child's health or any new diagnoses made during the year.
3. Please be sure to indicate any allergies at the time of registration and to inform the office of any changes during the year.
4. If you haven't already done so, please inform the Faith Formation Office if your child needs to bring emergency medications to class (e.g. Epi-pen, emergency inhaler, etc.)
5. We will not dispense medication of any kind. If your child is taking any type of medication that needs to be given during Faith Formation hours, a parent must be present.

If your child is displaying symptoms of an illness, please keep your child home.

CELL PHONE USE

1. No student is permitted to use a cell phone while in session.
2. Parents needing to contact their children must contact the office at 201-945-6599.
3. If a student uses a cell phone while in session, the following procedure will be followed:
 - a. 1st warning: Student will be asked to put the phone away.
 - b. 2nd warning: Catechist will take and hold the phone until the end of the session.
 - c. 3rd warning: Catechist will take the phone and turn it in to the Religious Education office. The phone will be held at the office until a parent comes to pick it up.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

All students are expected to share in the faith learning experience of the parish program. They do so by meeting the expectations previously outlined to the best of their ability. We want the children in our program to experience the Gospel values at all times.

Therefore, if a child's behavior disrupts the learning process for him or herself or for others, the following steps will be taken:

- At the first incident a verbal warning will be given by the catechist and the child will be reminded of the expectations.
- At the second incident the student will be sent to the office for a discussion with the Director.
- At the third incident the child is removed from the class and the parents are contacted.

All efforts will be made to work with the child and the family in order to resolve the issue in the most effective way possible. However, if the problem persists and cooperation is not evident by the child or parent, we reserve the right to remove the child from our regularly scheduled sessions.

This is another reason why consistent communication with our office regarding special needs or special family circumstances is important. Often these situations can impact a child's behavior. In order to best address your child's needs we hope to be well informed and any information you can give us is helpful to our catechists.

We appreciate your cooperation in this matter. Persistent problems with discipline may also impact the readiness of a child preparing for a sacrament. In that case, a parent conference may be necessary.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK POLICIES ON SACRAMENTS

FIRST HOLY RECONCILIATION: Students must participate in the Sacrament of First Reconciliation before they receive First Holy Communion. Children must have attended faith formation classes for two years year prior to their preparation for the sacrament.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION: A minimum of two full consecutive years of general catechesis/Faith Formation/CCD is required in order to receive First Communion. In addition to this, children and their families take part in any Parish sacrament preparation program. Children receiving First Holy Communion must first reach the “age of reason” (meaning 7 years old).

CONFIRMATION: A minimum of two full consecutive years of preparation is required in order to receive Confirmation. In addition to this, children and their families take part in any Parish sacrament preparation program.

Please note that we follow the archdiocesan policies and requirements for sacrament preparation. If a child is enrolled in our program after the second week of classes, that may not be considered a full year of faith formation. This will be taken into consideration when reviewing the child’s faith formation record in determining their eligibility for sacrament preparation. A full year of formation will be noted for new parishioners who enroll their children after the second week of classes and can verify that they have been attending religious education classes in their former parish. In these cases a transcript will be required.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Church of the Holy Rosary has a zero tolerance policy regarding abuse of any kind.

All catechists and volunteers have:

- Completed a thorough Volunteer Application.
- Had an interview with the director or the program coordinator.
- Undergone a criminal background check.
- Read and Signed the “Archdiocese of Newark Policies on Professional & Ministerial Conduct.”
- Attended a special workshop on child abuse prevention entitled “Protecting God’s Children.”

All certificates and records of compliance are on file in our office and a record is kept at the chancery.

No child is allowed to be in an unsupervised, one-to-one situation with any staff or volunteer in a remote or unobserved area. EVERYONE’S cooperation is needed in order to ensure a safe environment for our children. Any parent who suspects any type of abuse should notify the proper authorities directly. Parents should also notify the Director immediately. The Director will notify the pastor and will also notify the proper authorities, if parents have not done so already. Pursuant to state law, we are required to report suspected child abuse, and we will also follow diocesan policy on such matters.
